We encourage all students to access their Mathletics account at home or at school. It is a great resource to help students practise their Maths skills in an interactive way using technology. If your child does not have access to the internet at home to use Mathletics, arrangements can be made with your child's teacher so they can access Mathletics at school.


## **Education Week 2025**

## From Your Marrung Lead

The 27th of May marks the beginning of National Reconciliation Week. National Reconciliation Week (NRW) is a time for all Australians to learn about our shared histories, cultures, and achievements, and to explore how each of us can contribute to achieving reconciliation in Australia.

NRW always falls on the same dates each year, from 27 May to 3 June.

27 May marks the anniversary of the 1967 referendum when Australians voted to remove clauses in the Australian Constitution that discriminated against Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander peoples.

3 June marks the historic 1992 Mabo decision in which the High Court of Australia recognised native title—the recognition that Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander peoples' rights over their lands did survive British colonisation.

The day before NRW, 26 May, is National Sorry Day, which was first held in Sydney in 1998 and is now commemorated nationally to remember and honour the Stolen Generations.

There are a growing number of books written for young people to help them understand more about the Stolen Generation, Sorry Day, and the 1967 referendum, some of which we have in our library, such as "Say Yes" by Jennifer Castles.

In the lead up to our NRW commemoration, there is a colouring page in this newsletter for students to colour if they wish. All pages returned will be displayed in the library until the end of the term.



# **ThinkUKnow CyberSafety Presentations**

GWSPS will be hosting a ThinkUKnow presentation on **Wednesday 28th May at 5:30pm** for all parents, carers and teachers in the South Learning Studio. ThinkUKnow Australia is an evidence-based education program delivered nationally to prevent online child sexual exploitation. The presentation will be delivered by a local law enforcement member and an industry volunteer. The presentation is pro-technology and addresses topics including:

- What young people SEE, SAY and DO online
- The challenges they may face
- How to report and get help if things go wrong

ThinkUKnow Australia is a partnership between the Australian Federal Police, Microsoft Australia, Datacom and the Commonwealth Bank of Australia. The program is delivered in collaboration with policing partners New South Wales Police Force, Northern Territory Police, Queensland Police, South Australia Police, Tasmania Police, Western Australia Police, as well as Neighbourhood Watch Australasia.

This is a fantastic opportunity for you to learn more about young people and the online environment, and how you can help them to be safe and responsible users of technology. Due to the nature of the topics covered, please note that this session is NOT suitable for students. Students will be partaking in a separate information session later in the year.


