Attitudes to School Survey

Every year all our Level 4-6 students complete an 'Attitudes to School Survey'. This survey is completed online and enables students to reflect on their experiences at school. This data is used to inform future direction of the school. We are very proud of our results this year, which we believe are indicative of the work that has been put into our student wellbeing approaches.

We are still unpacking a lot of the data we received but we would like to share with you some of the initial results:

Spotlight on STEM

Levels 3 and 4 have come to the end of their first Food Tech unit. We celebrated my making some warming winter soup and the students asked that I share the recipe in the newsletter so that they can make it for their families over the holidays! They have also got our Food Tech Garden off to a great start with our seedlings taking off - we are looking forward to watching everything grow!

Vegetable and Mararoni Soup

- 1 tbsp olive oil
- 1 medium brown onion, finely chopped
- 2 garlic cloves, crushed
- 2 celery sticks, trimmed, cut into 2cm pieces
- 1 large carrot, cut into 2cm pieces
- 2 medium zucchinis, cut into 2cm pieces
- 2 cups tomato passata (pasta sauce)
- 1/3 cup dried macaroni
- 400g can cannellini beans, rinsed, drained 1/3 cup finely shredded fresh basil leaves Salt and pepper to taste

Step 1

Heat oil in a large saucepan over medium-high heat. Cook onion, garlic, celery, carrot and zucchini, stirring, for 5 minutes or until vegetables soften.

Step 2

Add passata and 4 cups cold water and bring it to the boil. Simmer, covered, for 10 minutes. Add pasta. Return to the boil and simmer, covered, for 10 minutes or until pasta and vegetables are tender.

Step 3

Add beans. Cook for 2 minutes until the beans and peas are heated through. Serve sprinkled with basil. Add salt and pepper to taste.



Curry Pumpkin Soup

1 tbsp olive oil

3/4 medium sized butternut pumpkin, skin and seeds removed, chopped

2 medium potatoes, chopped

1 large carrot, chopped

1 onion, chopped

2 cloves garlic, crushed

1-1 1/2 tsp KEEN'S Traditional Curry Powder

2 1/2 cups of vegetable stock

Step 1

Heat oil in a large saucepan over medium-high heat. Cook onion and garlic until softened. Add curry powder and stir.

Step 2

Add carrot, potato and pumpkin. Stir and cook for 5 minutes.

Step 3

Add vegetable stock and cook for 30 minutes or until vegetables are soft.

Step 4


Turn off the heat and allow it to cool slightly.
Using a food processor or stick blender, process until smooth.
