Parent/Caregiver/Guardian Opinion Survey

At GWSPS we value suggestions and ideas for future planning and improvement and encourage all families to provide feedback to our school so that we can continue to provide an engaging learning environment and extra-curricular opportunities for our students.

Our school is conducting a survey to find out what parents think of our school. The Parent Opinion Survey is an annual survey offered by the Department of Education and Training. It is designed to assist schools in gaining an understanding of parents' perceptions of school climate, student behaviour and student engagement. Our school will use the survey results to help inform and direct future school planning and improvement strategies.

All parents will have received an invitation in the coming weeks via Compass to participate in this year's survey. All responses to the survey are anonymous. This year the Parent Opinion Survey will be conducted

from **Monday 18**th **August to Friday 19**th **September.** The survey will be conducted online, only takes 15-20 minutes to complete, and can be accessed at any convenient time within the fieldwork period on desktop

computers, laptops, tablets or smartphones. The online survey will be available in a range of languages other than English. These include: Arabic, Greek, Hakha Chin, Hindi, Japanese, Punjabi, Simplified Chinese, Somali, Turkish, and Vietnamese.

The survey results will be reported back to the school at the end of September.

Illnesses

We are currently experiencing a number of illnesses within our school. To minimise the transmission of these illnesses, we ask that you please keep your child/ren home if they are sick.

If your child is absent from school for any medical reasons /medical appointments, we request that you please provide the school with a medical certificate or medical attendance notice. This can be uploaded directly to Compass when you are adding an attendance note or alternatively, you can email it to the office.

Swimming

The 2-week whole school intensive swimming program is set to begin on Monday the 18th of August and will run until Friday the 29th of August. Level 5/6 students will complete 10 days of the program, Monday-Friday both weeks. Students in Levels 1-4 will complete 8 days of the program, Monday-Thursday both weeks.

Swimming and water safety is a vital part of your child's education and is included in the Health and Physical Education curriculum from Foundation – Level 10. This requires schools to ensure that they are implementing a swimming and water safety program that meets the requirements of the curriculum.

We encourage all students to participate in this program. Please provide consent & payment on Compass by the due date. If you do not wish your child to participate in the swimming program, please contact your child's teacher directly via email to inform us.

Student Accident and Private Property Insurance

Please be aware that the Department of Education and Training (DET) does not provide personal accident insurance or ambulance cover for students. Parents and guardians of students, who do not have student accident insurance/ambulance cover, are responsible for paying the cost of medical treatment for injured students, including the cost of ambulance attendance/transport and any other transport costs.

In some circumstances, medical or other expenses will be paid by the Department where it is assessed that it is likely, that the Department is liable for negligent (careless) acts or omissions of its staff/volunteers. For more information about the claims process please go to:

Uniform

We have recently noticed that many of our students are out of uniform on a regular basis.


A uniform dress code reinforces in students a pride in their own appearance, instils recognition of themselves as an integral part of the school community, and assists in developing pride in representing their school. Issues of equality, health and safety, and expense are also factors that contribute to the establishment of the dress code. School Council has developed a dress code that we believe provides choice for the students, allows for students to safely engage in the many varied school activities, and caters for the financial constraints of families.

I'd like to draw your attention to the following, taken from our <u>Uniform Policy</u>:

- The dress code applies during school hours, while travelling to and from school, and when students are on school excursions.
- Stud earrings and sleepers worn in the ears, and watches are the only acceptable jewellery. Religious jewellery may be worn under clothing. Smart watches may be worn to school, but the school does not take responsibility for these.
- Extreme hair colours (eg: bleached, green, pink or purple rinses) and/or extreme hairstyles (eg: mohawks) are not permitted.
- Other than clear nail polish, cosmetics may not be worn at school.
- Hair accessories other than headbands/scrunchies/clips that match the school uniform are not permitted.
- Acceptable shoes must be black leather school shoes or black runners.
- Parents seeking exemptions to the dress code due to religious beliefs, ethnic or cultural background, student disability, health condition or economic hardship must apply in writing to the Principal.
- Students out of uniform are expected to bring a letter from their parent/guardian explaining the reason for the breach of dress code.
