New Values/New Logo

We are excited to officially launch our revised School Values!

Following thoughtful feedback from students, staff, and our wider school community throughout 2025, we have refreshed our school values to better reflect who we are and what we stand for. Our previous **R.E.S.P.E.C.T.** acronym has been refined to a strong and simple core value: **RESPECT** — no acronym, just a clear and powerful expectation that guides how we treat ourselves and others every day.

Alongside **RESPECT**, three additional core values have been selected by students, staff, and our community: **KINDNESS, HONESTY, and FAIRNESS**. These values represent the qualities we believe are essential in building a positive, inclusive, and supportive school culture.

You will notice our revised values featured in our updated logo, now displayed around the school and on new uniforms. Most importantly, students have already begun engaging deeply with these values through explicit teaching in the *Learning How to Learn* program during Weeks 1 and 2 of Term 1.




Wellbeing Update

Students created fantastic displays in the classroom to remind them of how we can be 'bucket fillers' who spread kindness every day.



Wellbeing Update

Students are explicitly taught to practise these values at school using our new **Positive Behaviours Matrix** (see below). The revised 'Learning How to Learn' program, conducted in Weeks 1 and 2 of Term 1, introduced students to these positive behaviour expectations using lots of examples and modelling.

NAPLAN - 11th-16th March

The National Assessment Program – Literacy and Numeracy (NAPLAN) involves students in Years 3 and 5 from all states and territories in Australia. NAPLAN testing will take place from Wednesday 11th March, through to Monday 16th March. Students' skills in reading, writing, language conventions (spelling, punctuation and grammar) and numeracy will be assessed. These national test results provide information on how your child is progressing and performing in the key areas of literacy and numeracy and also help to support improvements in teaching to benefit your child. Parents can support their children to be ready to participate in these assessment tasks by facilitating a smooth, calm start to each day. Please ensure that your child/ren have breakfast before coming to school and that they arrive to school on time.

Individual student NAPLAN reports will be forwarded to families later in the year. These reports will provide parents and staff with a snapshot of students' achievements but should not be seen as a definitive or comprehensive assessment. Thanks to Mrs Tineke Reincke for her organisation and coordination of the NAPLAN assessment and thank you to all staff involved in supervising.

Student Attendance - Every Day Counts



‘We all want our students to get a great education, and the building blocks for a great education begin with students coming to school each and every day. Missing school can have a major impact on a child’s future – **a student missing one day a fortnight will miss four full weeks by the end of the year. By Year 10 they’ll have missed more than a year of school.** There is no safe number of days for missing school – each day a student misses puts them behind and can affect their educational outcomes. Coming to school every day is vital, but if for any reason your child must miss school, there are steps you can take to ensure they don’t fall behind:

- Speak with your classroom teacher or year level coordinator and find out what work your child needs to do to keep up.
- Develop an absence learning plan with your school and ensure your child completes the plan. Remember, everyday counts. If your child must miss school, speak with your classroom teacher or year level coordinator as early as possible.’

Attending school every day means experiencing what counts - the learning, friendships, fun and opportunities that can shape their future.

The Importance of Being on Time

Being on time for school sets the tone for a successful day of learning. A calm, punctual start helps children feel settled, confident, and ready to engage with their lessons from the very first moment.

Morning Routine

- **Gates open:** 8:45am
- **First bell:** 8:55am
- **Learning begins:** 9:00am sharp
- **Gates close:** 9:00am

When the gates close at 9:00am, any students arriving after this time will need to enter through the school office to receive a late pass before going to class.

Why Being On Time Matters

Arriving at school on time:

-  Helps children start the day feeling organised and prepared
-  Prevents them from missing important instructions and learning activities
-  Builds positive routines and responsibility
-  Minimises disruption to their class and peers

The first few minutes of the school day are often when teachers outline the day's learning, explain key concepts, and set expectations. Missing this valuable time can make it harder for children to catch up and feel confident.

How Parents Can Help

- Establish a consistent bedtime routine
- Prepare school bags and uniforms the night before
- Allow extra time for busy mornings
- Aim to arrive at school a few minutes before the first bell

Being punctual not only supports your child's learning but also teaches lifelong skills such as responsibility, time management, and respect for others.




Term 1 Family Library Activity



Mental Health in Primary Schools (MhiPS) program

The Mental Health in Primary Schools program has now been expanded to all government and low-fee non-government primary schools. This year, Glen Waverley South Primary School has received funding to employ a Mental Health and Wellbeing Leader to implement a whole-school approach to mental health and wellbeing.

The program is based on a successful pilot created in partnership between the Department of Education, Murdoch Children's Research Institute and University of Melbourne.

What is the role of the Mental Health and Wellbeing Leader?

The key responsibility of the Mental Health and Wellbeing Leader, Mrs Annette Streets, is to help build the capacity of school staff to:

- identify mental health concerns in the classroom
- improve referral pathways for students requiring further assessment
- implement effective mental health strategies in the classroom. (It is important to highlight here that it is not the role of the Mental Health and Wellbeing Leader to do counselling or therapeutic 1:1 work with students.)

The Mental Health and Wellbeing Leader works with teachers and school leaders to further support systems and processes already established at GWSPS, in order to support students.







Birthday Treats at School

To avoid disappointment and to support the safety and well-being of all students, we request that Parents/Guardians read the following guidelines carefully.

We have a number of students at our school who are anaphylactic. Anaphylaxis is a severe, rapidly progressive allergic reaction that is potentially life threatening. Certain foods and insect stings are the most common causes of anaphylaxis.

It is very difficult to monitor the ingredients in foods that are brought in for birthdays. It is for this reason that we ask families to please follow these guidelines when bringing food to the school for a birthday.

These guidelines will be strictly adhered to by all staff.

- **No birthday lolly bags, no gift bags**
- **Only ONE item per child eg. one lollipop or one chocolate treat (freddo frog, kit kat etc)**
- **A list of ingredients MUST be supplied**
- **Food MUST be individually wrapped**
- **No nuts**
- **No homemade food**

If birthday treats do not meet the above guidelines, the treats will be returned home.

Birthday treats are to be delivered by the parent/guardian to the school office.

They will remain at the office until the end of the day when they will be distributed to the students by the classroom teacher at 3.30pm.
