Parent Payments for 2021

Dear Parents/Guardians

At Glen Waverley South Primary School, we are proud to offer our students a comprehensive and well-resourced educational program. The Victorian Government provides government schools with some funding towards the costs of teaching the standard curriculum and basic operational costs including staff wages, contract cleaning, gas, electricity, telephone, water rates, some maintenance of buildings, facilities and grounds, some curriculum support and professional development. Unfortunately, these government funds are not enough to support the programs offered at most schools. School Council therefore requires additional funds to be paid by families so that we can continue to provide the quality programs and facilities currently offered at Glen Waverley South Primary School. School Council makes every effort to keep all school costs and charges to a minimum and reasonable amount.

School Council has approved the attached Parent Payments structure for 2021. There are three categories of payments – Essential Student Learning Items, Optional Items and Voluntary Financial Contributions.

So that Glen Waverley South Primary School can continue to provide educational programs of a standard and quality expected by our school community, as well as maintain and improve our buildings, grounds, facilities and equipment, we ask all families to please consider making one or more of the Voluntary Financial Contributions listed in this document.

Timing of Payment

Payment of Essential Student Learning Items is due Monday 1st February 2021 however, we recognise that many parents will prefer to make their school payment for 2021, before the end of 2020. We are able to receive parent payments for 2021, at any time during the school day, from now until the end of term 4. There are several payment options available to parents:

1. Pay the full amount before the end of term 4 2020 (18/12/2020)
2. Pay on instalment dates via Compass (see below)
3. Pay the full amount by the due date of 01/02/2021
4. Pay in instalments through consultation with the Business Manager
5. Apply for Hardship Support (eligible families only) through consultation with the Assistant Principal

Compass Payment Plan Option

At Glen Waverley South Primary School, we understand that it is not always possible to pay for everything in full. It is for this reason that we offer a **COMPASS Payment Plan Option**. The Payment Plan is on set dates and enables you to pay for the 2021 Parent Payments in three instalments.

The payment plan dates are as follows:

- 1st Instalment Monday 7th December 2020
- 2nd Instalment Monday 5th January 2021
- 3rd Instalment Monday 1st February 2021

Payments plans must be set up on Compass before Sunday 6th December 2020. If the payment plan above does not suit your situation, please contact the Business Manager to create a payment plan that is tailored specifically to you.



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Payment Methods

Payments can be made through Compass, BPAY, by credit card, cheque or cash (further information attached).

Refunds

Refunds are all subject to the discretion of the Principal on a case by case basis, and usually follow the guidelines below.

Essential education items

Refunds are not available for payments made for essential education items that are retained by the student

Optional education items

As these are usually charged on a user-pays basis, refunds may be available for payments made for optional education items.

- A refund may be available if the school receives a credit for payments where a third party is involved (eg. admittance fees and charges, camp or excursion).
- A refund may be available if the student has not participated in the service, or received the item that has been paid for.
- A refund is not available where the school is out of pocket for any expenses.
- A refund is not available where payment for transport and entrance fees (etc) is a flat charge split across the number of students expected to attend.

Voluntary financial contributions

All refunds of voluntary financial contributions are subject to the discretion of the Principal on a case by case basis, and usually follow the guidelines below.

Refunds can be provided on a pro-rata basis if a student ceases to be enrolled at Glen Waverley Primary School. A written request for refund should be directed to The Principal at glen.waverley.ps@education.vic.gov.au

Financial Support for Families

School Council appreciates that families may sometimes experience financial difficulty and makes every effort to keep costs to a minimum to ensure the affordability for families. A number of support options are available to parents/guardians who have difficulty making payments including:

- Camps, Sports and Excursion Fund (for eligible parents/guardians)
- State Schools Relief
- Provision of second hand uniform items
- Local community supports

However, due to the uncertainty of restrictions in relation to COVID19 in 2021 the School Council has decided to invoice families throughout the year as events, excursions/incursions and sports carnivals occur. These activities are integral to your child’s learning and development. As such, it is an expectation of School Council that all children attend these activities. Eligible families can nominate to use CSEF towards camp, sports and excursions costs if applicable.

METHODS OF PAYMENT

COMPASS



Payments can be made either in full or as a payment plan via Course Confirmation and Payments.

1. Log into Compass using your parent login details (contact the school office if you have any issues)
2. Open **Course Confirmation and Payments** and select the payments that you would like to make.
3. Either **pay in full** or a **Payment Plan** (if you choose payment plan, the total amount that you have chosen to pay will be divided by 3 and that will be the total amount deducted per instalment).
4. Complete your Debit/Credit Card details and submit.
